## Brock's Polka Queen aiming for Grammy Award

Heidi Klose could very well be considered Brock's Polka Queen.

Klose, Administrative Assistant in the Department of History, contributed a song to a polka album that is now nominated for a Grammy Award.

Klose wrote the lyrics to the song "That Sweet Sound," which appears on the Grammy-nominated album *Pangora's Box*, by John Gora & Gorale. The CD was nominated in Category 73 for "Best Polka Album."

Klose has been writing lyrics for several years, in many different genres of music, but this is her first song that has ever been recorded.

"It was a pleasant surprise to

have my first recorded song end up on a Grammy-nominated album," said Klose.

John Gora has been nominated for a Grammy twice before. Both he and Klose are hopeful that this third nomination will bring success.

The album will face stiff competition, as three-time Grammy winner and St. Catharines resident Walter Ostanek is also nominated in the category for his album with Gaylord Klancnik, entitled *Polkas United*.

The 47th Annual Grammy Awards will be presented in Los Angeles, Ca. at STAPLES Center on February 13.
